Governing body effectiveness and impact

What were the significant challenges for the governing body in 2016/7?

The new KS2 tests proved a challenge for the school and the GB needed to be more rigorous in their monitoring, visits and governance duties.

The budget was in shortfall.

The national assessment system changed and scaled scores were introduced rather than levels.

The governors needed to be more rigorous at holding the school leaders to account.

How were the challenges met?

The school re-visited the new national curriculum and tests and made changes to the curriculum in both Key Stages, and worked to the recently released new assessment framework.

Some new staff were appointed.

Internal and external moderation was reinforced and monitored by governors.

Governors continue to work with the Senior Leadership Team to ensure the school moves forward.

Governors increased their strategic and monitoring role in all areas.

Prudent expenditure and monitoring corrected the budget shortfall by year end.

What were the achievements of the governing body for 2016/7?

Support and challenge for the school in making the changes to adapt to the new tests and working with the school to ensure the budget was back on track by the end of the financial year.

A new deputy headteacher was appointed.

Levels of holding the school to account were increased and monitoring by governors was focussed to key areas.

Governors attended courses.

Three new parent governors were elected in July 2017 and their skills enhance those already present on the GB.

A new clerk was appointed.

How have these achievements improved areas of school life (impact)?

Resources to support learning have all been purchased.

Play equipment has been purchased.

The school is fully staffed.

Governors have a greater understanding of their roles and are more able to hold the headteacher and members of staff to account.

Teaching and accountability of leaders in both Key Stages has improved and the impact can be seen in the improving data the school has given to governors.

The budget is stable.

Results across the school have improved.
